



# About the Kiwanis Music Education Fund:

- 1. The goal of the Kiwanis Music Education Fund is to provide private music lessons and instruments to children that demonstrate passion, commitment and enthusiasm for music but can not afford the cost of private music lessons.
- 2. Bursaries will be distributed based on financial need.
- 3. All applicants will be required to contribute a minimum of \$5 per lesson, with the remaining costs being either fully or partially covered.
- 4. The number of recipients and amounts awarded will be dependent on the funding available at the time of submission.
- 5. Recipients may take lessons with a teacher of their choice. If the recipient does not currently have a private teacher, they will be matched with a qualified instructor from one of our reputable community partner schools.
- 6. Recipients may also be eligible to receive assistance with the cost of an instrument (either to rent or purchase).
- 7. Bursaries will be awarded for 12-week terms. Recipients will automatically be considered for an extension at the end of their term, based on a review of their participation in the program and continued demonstration of financial need.
- 8. Recipients who wish to enter the KW Kiwanis Music Festival may have their class fees reduced.

# Eligibility:

- 1. Applicants must be between the ages of 9 and 18 years of age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025.
- 2. Applicants must already be involved in a music program or have some musical experience. This may include school music programs, community classes or private lessons.
- 3. Applicants must demonstrate a commitment and promise in their musical studies.
- 4. A reference letter must be provided by a teacher or community member, describing the applicant's involvement and commitment to their music education.
- 5. The applicant's parent or guardian must demonstrate a financial need.
- 6. Should the applicant be awarded a music lessons bursary their continuation in the program will be dependent on good attendance and commitment to practicing in preparation for their music lessons. This must be verified by the assigned teacher at regular intervals.

# **Application Form:**

- Applications must be submitted by February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2025, to be eligible for the spring lesson term, July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025 for the fall lesson term or by November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2025 to be eligible for the winter lesson term.
