#### 3. REGISTRATION & ACCOUNTS

- 3.1 Agreement By registering for the KWKMF you agree to be bound the festival rules & regulations. Participants may be disqualified from any or all present and future festival activities, awards, or honours in situations where festival rules are explicitly disregarded.
- 3.2 **Right of Refusal** KWKMF has the right to refuse any registration for any reason.
- 3.3 Registration Registration must be done online via the <u>KWKMF Website</u>. Click on <u>Syllabus &</u> <u>Registration</u> in the main menu and select the appropriate category to find class details and select the class(es) you wish to register for. Registration can be completed by a parent, teacher, or adult student. \*We are using a new registration system for the 2025 festival. You will need to create a new account when you start the registration process.
- 3.4 **Registration Waiver** Registrants will be required to consent to a release waiver at the time of registration, acknowledging that KWKMF Rules & Regulations must be abided by all participants. If you are

completing registration for an ensemble, it is the registrant's responsibility to ensure that each ensemble member is also aware of the Rules & Regulations.

- 3.5 **Photo Consent Release** The KWKMF is a public event, and festival media persons may be taking photos during festival classes. Registrants will be given the option to consent to the use of their/their child's images for festival media channels (website, social media, posters). The KWKMF will not include people's names when publishing photos. If you are completing registration for an ensemble, it is the registrant's responsibility to ensure that each ensemble member is aware of the Photo Consent Release.
- 3.6 **Registration by Teachers** Teachers may register on their student's behalf. Please see 3.4 and 3.5 above regarding waivers and consent it is the teacher's responsibility to ensure that their students' parents are aware of the Rules & Regulations and the Photo Consent Waiver.
- 3.7 **Eligibility** KWKMF is open to amateur musicians only. For the KWKMF, an amateur is a person whose primary income stream is in something other than the festival activity they are entering for.
- 3.8 **Age Limit** Competitive classes are open to participants up to the age of 28 as of December 31, 2024. Adults aged 29+ are only eligible for non-competitive or adult amateur classes.
- 3.9 **Class Limits** Participants may only register once for each competitive class. Participants may register multiple times for the same Non-Competitive class, playing the appropriate number of pieces for each registration.
- 3.10 **Transaction & Late Fees** Lists of class prices are included in this Syllabus under each division and on the website. A parent or adult may register for several classes and multiple family members all at once. Classes may be saved and added later prior to paying for classes. **Registration will not be complete until the payment is made. A \$5 Transaction Fee per cart will be charged at the time of payment.** If a participant registers for additional classes after paying, the \$5 fee will be applied again each time a payment is made, therefore it is recommended that payment be done once all classes are entered. Registrations that are paid after the registration deadline are subject to a \$10 Late Fee.
- 3.11 **Cancellations & Refunds** Fees for cancelled classes may be refunded up to February 15<sup>th</sup> of the festival year (the \$5 Transaction Fee is non-refundable). **There will be NO REFUNDS after February 15th** if the participant chooses to refrain from participating in a festival class for which they have registered, except when a doctor's note is provided or in cases of bereavement.
- 3.12 **Class Changes** Participants may request to change a class registration to a different class up to February 15<sup>th</sup>. After this date there are no guarantees that a change request will be considered and will only be done at the discretion of the Festival Coordinator. Requests must be submitted by email to (danielle@kwkiwanismusicfestival.com).
- 3.13 **Class Verification by Teachers** It is recommended that teachers verify their students have registered for the correct classes. Parents/students should send their registration information to their teacher once completed to ensure they have entered the correct levels and class categories.

#### 4. HEALTH & SAFETY PROTOCOLS

- 4.1 The 2025 KWKMF is planned to be an in-person live event with no virtual classes unless government protocol dictates otherwise.
- 4.2 All festival events will follow current government health and safety protocols, guidelines, and recommendations.
- 4.3 Any person entering a festival venue must abide by all health & safety measures required by the venue. Refusal to abide by venue regulations may result in disqualification from participating in the festival.
- 4.4 The festival cannot take responsibility for any person contracting COVID-19 or any other illness at a festival event. Persons enter festival venues at their own risk.

Festival Inquiries: Contact the KWKMF Coordinator <u>danielle@kwkiwanimusicfestival.com</u> 4.5 Should government guidelines require that the live festival be cancelled the KWKMF is prepared to host a virtual festival. Participants would be emailed instructions on how to submit recorded video performances, and how to join their online classes. Participants would be given the option to receive a full refund if they do not wish to participant in a virtual festival.

#### 5. FINANCIAL AID

- 5.1 Participants who meet any of the criteria below should contact the Festival Coordinator to confirm their eligibility prior to completing their registration (<u>Danielle@kwkiwanismusicfestival.com</u>). To receive financial aid participants must first pay their registration invoice in full, and the fees will be refunded back to them.
- 5.2 Accompaniment Allowance Participants who register for four (4) or more classes that require a live accompanist are eligible to receive up to \$50 towards their costs. The KWKMF must be able to verify their accompanist's contact information and fees to qualify for a reduction in fees.
- 5.3 **Festival Bursary** Participants who are experiencing financial constraints that would prevent them from registering for the festival are welcome to write a letter to the festival committee explaining their situation and why they want to participate in the music festival, and which classes they would like to register for. Some or all their class fees may be waived at the discretion of the KWKMF Committee. Request for financial aid must be received by January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025.
- 5.4 **Kiwanis Music Education Fund** Students who are currently receiving a bursary from the Kiwanis Music Education Fund will have their festival class fees waived. They will still be required to pay the \$5 registration fee.

#### 6. SCHEDULING & COMMUNICATIONS

- 6.1 **2025 Festival Dates** The 2025 KWKMF will take place from April 7<sup>th</sup> to 11th for Ensemble Classes and April 12<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> for Solo & Chamber Music Classes. Classes may be scheduled during daytime and evening hours. It is recommended that participants reserve all festival dates. Note: Ensemble Classes include School & Community groups. Solo Classes include solos, duets and trios within each division.
- 6.2 **Good Friday 2025** Classes may be scheduled on Good Friday (April 18<sup>th</sup>, 2025). Please notify the Festival Coordinator by email (<u>danielle@kwkiwanismusicfestival.com</u>) if you are unable to attend classes on this date due to religious considerations no later than January 30<sup>th</sup>, 2025.
- 6.3 **Registration Dates** Online registration will be open from December 1st to January 24th. Late registration will be extended to February 2nd subject to a \$10 late fee. Registrations will not be accepted after February 2nd.
- 6.4 **Published Schedule** The schedule will be published online no later than March 1<sup>st</sup> for Ensemble Classes and no later than March 15<sup>th</sup> for Solo Classes. Class schedules will also be available by logging into your festival account.
- 6.5 **Schedule Changes** KWKMF reserves the right to change the published schedule at any time. KWKMF will attempt to notify the affected participants of major changes, however it is the responsibility of each participant, music teacher and accompanist to check the website for changes.
- 6.6 Communication The official mode of communication for festival announcements is through the festival website, as well as email communications. Participants should check the website regularly for festival updates. Participants should check their spam folders to ensure that KWKMF emails are being received. KWKMF has the right to email anyone who has an active festival account. Those who no longer wish to participate in the festival and receive email communications must deactivate their account.

- 6.7 **Schedule Conflicts** Participants who are registering for multiple classes and divisions are guaranteed to not be double-booked. However, the festival cannot guarantee that family members will not be booked at the same time.
- 6.8 **Personal Requests** The festival schedule will not be modified in response to requests made based on personal schedule conflicts. A personal schedule conflict would include travel, school, other competitions, other extra-curricular activities, etc.

#### 7. GENERAL CLASS RULES & REGULATIONS

- 7.1 **Outlined below** are the general rules & regulations that apply to all festival divisions. Each division also has its own set of classes and guidelines that are included in each section of the Syllabus. Participants and their teachers are responsible to ensure they are registering for the appropriate classes and following the guidelines for each different class.
- 7.2 Failure to follow the Rules & Regulations will disqualify participants from receiving a mark or class placement. Participants may still receive written and verbal evaluations from the adjudicator.
- 7.3 **Syllabus Lists** Many classes require that repertoire be selected from a corresponding syllabus list. It is the participants' responsibility to consult the appropriate list. (See 2. Resources & Links)
- 7.4 **Class Levels** See Section 8 to see the eligibility for various class levels.
- 7.5 **Repertoire Level** Participants must perform repertoire that is listed under the corresponding grade level in the RCM, CC or LC syllabus and are not permitted to play pieces listed in a different grade level. **There are no exceptions**, even when a higher-level piece has been approved by RCM or CC for examination purposes.
- 7.6 **Syllabus Exceptions** Participants who wish to play a piece that is not on a syllabus list can do so if 1) they provide a letter of approval from the RCM or CC for examination purposes (excluding exceptions for higher level pieces), and/or 2) they submit a request for approval to the KWKMF Coordinator no later than January 31, 2025. Requests will be forwarded to a designated committee to determine if the piece is appropriate for a particular grade level and class. \*\*Participants who are nominated to the OMFA Provincials should be aware that the OMFA Syllabus does not allow for repertoire exceptions.
- 7.7 **Syllabus Conflicts** 1) Where there are conflicts between newer and older editions of a syllabus students must follow the most recent syllabus and 2) Where there are conflicts between the RCM and CC syllabi, participants may choose which syllabus to use. For example, if a piece is listed in the RCM syllabus as Level 6 but is listed as Level 7 in the CC syllabus the student may choose to enter the level that generally aligns with their other class entries. If there is a piece that appears in an older edition of a syllabus but is not listed in any level in the newest edition, then that piece is allowed.
- 7.8 **Repertoire Selections** A repertoire selection may only be played once during the festival, and participants cannot perform the same selection in different classes. Exception: Participants entering in the KWCO Concerto Competition may perform the same concerto selection in a Levelled class where the syllabus lists include concertos (this applies to strings and wind instruments).
- 7.9 **Repeats & Signs** It is recommended that repeats signs should be ignored unless they significantly influence the structure of the piece. *Da Capo & Del Segno* signs should generally be observed. Participants should consult the appropriate RCM or CC Syllabi for guidance.
- 7.10 **Multi-movement Selections** One (1) Selection may consist of multiple movements. Participants must perform the number of movements specified for each class where applicable. Some KWKMF classes require a limit of two (2) movements, others require participants follow the RCM or CC syllabus requirements. Multiple movements should be played back-to-back with a brief pause in between.
- 7.11 **Time Limit** Total performance time must not exceed **twenty (20) minutes** in total for any class. In cases where multiple movements are to be performed, and the total performance time would exceed

Festival Inquiries: Contact the KWKMF Coordinator <u>danielle@kwkiwanimusicfestival.com</u> twenty (20) minutes participants may omit one (1) movement subject to the approval of the KWKMF Coordinator. Selected movements should be contrasting and should reflect the difficulty level of the class. The adjudicator may stop any performance that exceeds the 20 minute time limit.

- 7.12 Accompaniment Most classes in the Brass, Strings, Voice, Woodwinds and Piano Concerto divisions require that participants must perform with live piano accompaniment. Participants should consult their division syllabus carefully regarding accompaniment rules. Performers are responsible for making all arrangements with, and payment to their accompanist. Participants who register for four (4) or more accompanied classes are eligible for a \$35 Accompaniment Allowance (See 5. Financial Aid)
- 7.13 **Backing Tracks** For Competitive Popular Vocal Solo and Recital classes only, participants must use an instrumental backing track that does not have back-up vocals. (Exceptions: Self-Accompanied, Singer-Songwriter, and Non-Competitive vocal classes may be accompanied by piano, guitar or ukulele). Performers are encouraged to use tracks with limited instrumental breaks (edited tracks/ reductions are allowed). Backing tracks must be provided as an MP3 file prior to the festival class (registrants will be contacted with instructions for submission). Backing tracks may be purchased from www.karaoke-version.com.
- 7.14 **Microphones** For Competitive Popular Vocal Solo and Recital classes at the Elementary Level and up participants must use a microphone. Microphones are optional for Beginner and Primary levels, and for all non-competitive classes.
- 7.15 **Copyright** In accordance with the Canadian Copyright Act participants must provide the adjudicator with a legally purchased copy of the music for all selections, even when the piece is being performed by memory. A purchase receipt must be presented for digital copies. Music that is in the public domain, and therefore available to be downloaded for free, must have the IMSLP listing attached (visit <u>imslp.org</u> to print a screen shot). In etude, duet and ensemble classes, photocopied pages may be used by the performers long as the original score is also provided. Participants who bring photocopied music without the original score or proof of purchase will be disqualified from receiving a class mark or placement.
- 7.16 **Memorization** is required for most competitive classes, with exceptions noted in the syllabus for each division (for example: Brass, Woodwinds, Sonatas for Strings and Etudes do not need to be memorized).

#### 8. CLASS LEVELS & ELIGIBILITY

- 8.1 Preparatory, Levels 1-10 Participants must enter a grade level that is higher than their most recent examination as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024. For example, if a student passes a Level 3 exam in December, then they must enter classes at Level 4 or higher. If a student passes a Level 3 exam anytime after January 1, 2025, then they may still enter Level 3 classes.
- 8.2 **Open (Diploma) Level** Participants must enter at the Open Level if they have completed a Level 10 examination as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, or if they are currently performing repertoire at the ARCT, ACCM level or above, regardless of whether they have completed a Diploma level examination.
- 8.3 **Age Level Classes** For class levels that are based on age participants must enter the level based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024.
- 8.4 **Ensemble Classes** Participants must enter the level based on the age of the oldest participant as of December 31st, 2024.
- 8.5 Adult & Non-Competitive Classes Non-Competitive classes are available to participants of all ages and experience levels in each division and will be organized based on registration so that participants of similar ages and levels will be grouped together. Adult amateurs may enter any Non-Competitive class. Adult-Child groups may enter Non-Competitive Ensemble classes. (See page 10 for more details). Participants do not need to follow any syllabus list and may perform any repertoire of their choosing that is appropriate for the genre of the class. In Popular Voice class participants may sing with or without a microphone and may use either live accompaniment or a backing track.

#### 9. FESTIVAL CODE OF CONDUCT

- 9.1 **Contact with Adjudicators** Contacting an adjudicator (by participants, parents, teachers, or accompanists) to discuss festival related matters at any point during the festival year is strictly prohibited. Adjudicators are required to report such correspondence to the festival committee.
- 9.2 **Class Results** All decisions made by a festival adjudicator with respect to class outcome, awards, provincial delegation, and concert performer nominations are irrevocable. By registering for the festival, you agree to accept all the festival results as final, even if you disagree with them.
- 9.3 **Dress Code** It is recommended that participants wear attire appropriate for performing. Participants should avoid clothing with visible corporate logos, sports team names or logos, copyrighted images, celebrity names or images (living or dead), cartoon character images, or inappropriate messages or words (for example, profanity).
- 9.4 **Performance Introductions** Participants should announce their name, the title of their selection(s), and the name of the composer before performing.
- 9.5 **Respecting Spaces** Participants must use all venue facilities in a respectful manner and Health & Safety protocols in place at festival venues must be followed. Intentional destruction of property or failure to leave a space in clean condition will result in disqualification from all current and future festival events.
- 9.6 **Respecting People** All festival participants, teachers, parents, adjudicators, and volunteers are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that is respectful of the people around them. Abusive or disrespectful behaviour will result in disqualification from all current and future festival events.
- 9.7 **Use of Pianos** Participants may not play a festival piano outside of their designated festival performance time.
- 9.8 Use of Devices & Recording Phones and other devices must be Silenced or set to Do Not Disturb and during festival classes. Photography and recording in performance spaces is strictly prohibited except for KW Kiwanis Music Festival media persons and family members of the current performer. A designated seat will be available during classes for the current performer's family member to record. Photography and recording of other participants or the adjudicator workshops are not allowed.

#### **CLASS EVALUATIONS, MARKS & PLACEMENTS**

All participants will receive written and verbal evaluations from the adjudicator. In competitive classes participants will also receive a mark (out of 100) and 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Place will be awarded based on class marks. Participants must earn a mark of 80 or higher to qualify for a class placement. Seals of Standard will be given based on marks: Gold for a mark of 90 and above, Silver for a mark of 85-89 and Bronze for a mark of 80-84. At the end of each class the adjudicator will announce the class placements but will not disclose the marks.

For School & Community Ensemble classes 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> placements will not be assigned, but the adjudicator will announce the Seals of Standard that are awarded to each ensemble.

#### **CLASS RIBBONS**

Participants who are awarded 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> Place will receive a designated Ribbon. All other participants (including those in Non-Competitive classes) will receive a Participant Ribbon.

#### **FINANCIAL AWARDS**

Thanks to generous donations made by the Kiwanis Club of Kitchener-Waterloo, several long-time major donors, and many donations by individuals each year, the festival distributes between \$8000 to \$20000 annually to deserving festival participants. Individual awards may range from \$25 to \$500 and will be distributed throughout all divisions and class levels. Adjudicators are provided with a list of Awards available within their division and will have sole discretion in distributing the available Awards.

Award packages are presented on stage at the Finale Concert and recipients are invited participate in the awardrecipient group photo. Recipients of the Allan Bush \$500 Top Awards, if invited, are expected to perform at the Finale Concert to receive their award. (Award recipients who do not pick up their award will have it mailed to them).

Award packages contain a cheque with the participants name on it and a letter indicating the who donated the award along with their contact information. Award recipients are encouraged to write a thank you letter to the donor of their award. Note: Expired award cheques are not reissued.

#### TROPHIES

The top performer in each division and in some cases a particular class will receive an annual trophy which will be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicators and presented at the Finale Concert. Trophy Winners will have their name and year inscribed on a large trophy that they will get to keep until next year's festival. Trophies must be returned to the festival Coordinator at the start of the 2026 festival. Winners will also be given a smaller version of the trophy that they may keep permanently. Trophies will be presented on stage at the Finale Concert. Students who are not able to attend must contact the Festival Coordinator to arrange to pick up the trophy.

#### HONOURS ANNOUNCEMENTS

Class Placements, Award Recipients, Trophy Winners, and Provincial Delegates will be announced on the KWKMF website at the conclusion of the festival.

#### FINALE CONCERT – FRIDAY MAY 2<sup>ND</sup>, 2025 AT 7:00PM

The Finale Concert program aims to celebrate the achievement of all festival participants by featuring excellent performances that represent as many divisions, levels, genres, and styles as possible. Adjudicators nominate performances from their division and then a committee selects the program from the collective list of adjudicator-nominated performers. Performers are invited to perform at the finale concert by email and are expected to reply within 24 hours to confirm their availability.

In addition to the performances, the Finale Concert will include presentations to trophy winners, provincial delegates, concerto competition winners, and award winners.

Performers requiring piano accompaniment are welcome to hire their own accompanist or use the festival-hired accompanist for which there will be one rehearsal earlier in the day on the day of the finale concert.

The Finale Concert will be live streamed on the KWKMF website, and audience members must purchase a ticket to attend the live show. Honours recipients and performers will be granted free admission.

#### **OMFA** PROVINCIALS

The KW Kiwanis Music Festival is a feeder festival for the Ontario Music Festival Association Provincial Competition. At the end of each festival, adjudicators nominate up to three (3) delegates as well as alternates for each eligible division and level to compete at the OMFA Provincials. Nominees will be notified via email and will have 48 hours to accept or decline their nomination. If one or more of the nominees decline, then the next alternate on the list will be notified. Those who compete in the OMFA Provincials will receive a Provincial Delegate Certificate, which will be presented at the Finale Concert. (Those who do not attend the ceremony will have their Certificate mailed to them).

Students must receive a mark of 85 or higher to qualify for a provincial nomination. Most OMFA classes require that participants perform two (2) selections, therefore adjudicators will give preference to participants who perform two (2) or more selections during the KWKMF when deciding who to nominate. It some cases the adjudicator may nominate a participant who only plays one (1) selection, but that participant should be prepared to perform a second or third piece as required by the OMFA if they accept the nomination.

OMFA rules stipulate that nominees must accept the first invitation that they receive from any festival. Therefore, if a participant enters multiple Ontario music festivals, they must accept the first festival nomination they receive and will not be permitted to accept an invitation at a later date on behalf of another festival (regardless of whether they declined the first invitation).

Specific information about OMFA Provincial requirements for each division can be found under each section of this syllabus.

The KW Kiwanis Music Festival is proud to host the 2025 OMFA Provincials in Kitchener-Waterloo during the week of June 9<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup>. More information including registration and syllabus rules & regulations can be found on the <u>OMFA website</u>.

# ADULT & NON-COMPETITIVE CLASSES

The KW Kiwanis Music Festival offers Non-Competitive and Adult Amateur Classes which are open to participants of all ages, levels & styles who wish to have a fun and educational experience without the pressure of competition. Classes are available in all divisions listed in this Syllabus. In Non-Competitive classes students will receive written and verbal feedback from the adjudicator and a Participant's Ribbon as they would in any other class. Performances will not be assigned a mark, and since participants are not competing, they will not receive class placements.

Adult Amateurs classes are non-competitive and are available to participants who are 29 years of age or older. Adult-Child groups can register for any Non-Competitive Ensemble class. Adult Amateurs may be nominated to participate in the OMFA Provincials where applicable. (Adults ages 29 or older are not eligible to enter in competitive classes).

Non-Competitive classes will be organized based on registration so that participants of similar ages, levels and styles will be grouped together.

To register for a Non-Competitive class participants should select the appropriate Discipline they wish to be involved in (for example: Voice or Strings) and then select "Non-Competitive" or "Adult Amateur" from the class options.

# KW COMMUNITY ORCHESTRA CONCERTO COMPETITION

The KWCO Concerto Competition offers students the exciting opportunity to play in concert with the Kitchener-Waterloo Community Orchestra. Three (3) Winners and two (2) Runner-Ups will be chosen from this class to perform their Concerto on Saturday May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025. The winners will also receive two (2) complimentary concert tickets.

Each year the Concerto Competition will be available to different instruments groups. For the 2025 KWKMF it is open to Piano participants, and the following year it will be open to Strings and Winds participants (subject to change at the discretion of KWCO).

#### **ELIGIBILITY, RULES & REGULATIONS:**

- Piano players ages 12-18 as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, are eligible to enter. **Exception:** Previous Concerto Competition winners who have performed with the KWCO are not permitted to enter.
- Entry fee: \$38. Registrants must select "KWCO Concerto Competition" on the Syllabus page of the website.
- Concertos must be performed with live piano accompaniment; participants provide their own accompanist.
- Participants must perform one (1) movement of a Concerto.
- The score must be available on <u>IMSLP.org</u> (International Music Score Library Project).
- Repertoire selections must be approved by KWCO, which must be submitted by January 31, 2025.
- Potential winners must be available for rehearsals and the KWCO Concert on the following dates:
  - Rehearsals: Tuesdays at 7:00 pm during the month of May 2025
  - Dress Rehearsal: Saturday May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025, at 9:30 am
  - Concert: Saturday May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025, at 7:30 pm
- Winners are expected to dress in appropriate concert attire for the performance.

## SCHOOL & COMMUNITY ENSEMBLE DESCRIPTIONS

**Chamber Music** Chamber Music ensembles may include 3-5 players, with one player per part, all the parts having equal importance, and should not have a conductor. Members can include any combination of orchestral instruments including strings, woodwinds, brass, harp, guitar, recorder, and/or percussion, with or without piano and/or one vocal part. **Levels:** Chamber Ensembles should enter based on the highest level represented within the group. For example, if some of the ensemble members are playing at a grade 5 level, but one or more members are playing at a grade 7 level then the ensemble must register for the Junior (Levels 6-9) class.

\*\*Note: Duet & Trio class options are available within each instrument division (example: Piano Duets should register in the Piano division). Trios consisting of the same instrument family (ex. 3 brass instruments) should register under their instruments' division, whereas a Trio consisting of mixed instrumentation should register in the Chamber Music division (ex. a trio with violin, piano and flute). Piano and Vocal quartets should register in those divisions.

**Jazz/Pop/Rock Bands** May include 3-10 players and may include vocals and a mix of acoustic and electric instruments. Microphones will be available for vocals and acoustic instruments. A basic drum kit set up will be provided. A detailed list of available sound gear will be provided to participants in advance (any additional gear that is required must be brought by the participants). **Class Levels:** Bands should enter the age group the represents the majority of the ensemble members. If there is an equal number of members in different age groups participants should enter the higher age level.

**Small Ensembles** May include 4-15 ensemble members, may have multiple players per part, and can be either self-led or conductor led. Small Ensemble Options include *Guitar/Ukulele Ensemble, Percussion Ensemble, Wind Ensemble, Strings Ensemble and Chamber Choir.* **Class Levels:** Small Ensembles should enter the age group that represents the majority of the ensemble members. If there is an equal number of members in different age groups participants should enter the higher age level.

**Large Ensembles** Includes groups with 15 or more ensemble members, with multiple players per part and is conductor-led. Large Ensemble Options include *Concert Band, Stage/Jazz Band, String Orchestra, Symphony Orchestra and Concert Choir.* **Class Levels:** Large Ensembles should enter at the level the represents the majority of the ensemble members.

## SCHOOL & COMMUNITY CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Chamber Music Solo Participants must perform one (1) selection.

**Chamber Music Recital** Participants must perform two contrasting (2) selections.

**20 Minute Workshop** Ensembles will have a total of 20 minutes on stage including both their performance time and the adjudicator's workshop. Ensembles may perform one (1) or two (2) selections with a recommended performance time limit of 6 minutes to allow time for the workshop. If an ensemble chooses to play two (2) selections the adjudicator will assign one mark which is the average for both pieces. No preference will be given based on how many pieces the participant plays.

**30 Minute Workshop** Ensembles will have a total of 30 minutes on stage including both their performance time and the adjudicator's workshop. Ensembles must play two (2) selections, with a recommended performance time limit of 10 minutes to allow time for the workshop.

## **ENSEMBLE RULES & REGULATIONS**

**Failure to follow the Rules & Regulations** below will disqualify participants from receiving a mark or class placement. Participants may still receive written and verbal evaluations from the adjudicator.

\*\*Participants should consult the 7. General Rules & Regulations and 8. Class Levels & Eligibility sections of the Syllabus.

**Multi-movement Selections** One (1) selection may consist of multiple movements. No more than two (2) contrasting movements are permitted to be played for a selection.

**Scores & Sheet Music** Participants must provide the adjudicator with a legally purchased copy of the music for all selections (a purchase receipt or IMSLP listing must be presented for digital copies), even when the piece is being performed by memory. For Jazz/Pop/Rock bands may provide a lead/lyric sheet if there is no sheet music available. Refer to section 7.14 of the Rules, Regulations & Guidelines for more information about Copyright.

**Arrangements, Cuts & Improvisation** Jazz/Pop/Rock bands may perform their own arrangements. Vocal parts should only make cuts for repeated choruses (all verses should be included). Cuts to extended instrumental sections are allowed for Rock and Pop bands. Jazz Combos must include the head at the start and end of their performance. Improvised solos are permitted.

**Time Limit** Total performance time must not exceed **twenty (20) minutes** in total for Chamber Music classes.

Memorization is not required for Ensemble classes.

**Class Awards** Participants in competitive ensemble classes will be awarded a Gold, Silver or Bronze Seal of Standard based on their marks: Gold for a mark of 90 and above, Silver for a mark of 85-89, and Bronze for a mark of 80-84. Marks will be recorded on comment sheets but will not be shared with the class, and no class placements (I.e., 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>) will be announced.

**General Rules & Regulations** Entrants must ensure they are familiar with General Rules & Regulations (page 5-6).

### **OMFA PROVINCIAL REQUIREMENTS**

Participants should consult the OMFA Syllabus guidelines (<u>www.omfa.ca</u>) if they are interested in participating in the OMFA Provincials, as the OMFA requirements may differ from the KW Kiwanis Music Festival Syllabus. At least one (1) selection must have received a mark of 85 at the local festival.

**Chamber Music** One (1) Selection, 1 or more movements may be performed.

**Small Ensembles** One (1) or Two (2) selections may be performed. Only one selection may have a brief solo passage that may not exceed 20% of the total length of the piece.

#### **BRASS SYLLABUS**

#### **BRASS CLASS DESCRIPTIONS**

**Brass Solo** Participants must perform one (1) selection from the appropriate grade level and any Repertoire list in their instrument's RCM or CC Syllabus. Accompaniment is required (see Rules & Regulations below).

**Brass Recital** Participants must perform two contrasting (2) selections from the appropriate grade level and from different Repertoire lists in their instrument's RCM or CC Syllabus. For example, if the grade level includes List A & List B the participant should play one (1) selection from each list. If there is a List C, then the participant may choose which two (2) Lists to select from. Accompaniment is required (see Rules & Regulations below).

**Etude Classes** Participants must perform two (2) contrasting Etudes/Studies from the appropriate grade level. Where the syllabus indicates "*Group 1*", and "*Group 2*" participants should select one (1) Etude from each Group.

**Brass Concerto** Participants may perform one (1) or two (2) consecutive movements of a concerto. Repertoire selections do not need to be from a syllabus list. Participants must enter the level based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, and should select the grade level that they are currently playing at.

**Popular Classes** Participants must perform one (1) selection for **Solo** classes or two (2) selections for **Recital** classes. Popular selections should be covers from commercial artists in any of the following genres: Pop, Folk, R&B, Soul, Rock, Alternative, Indie, Jazz or Country. Songs listed in the RCM or CC syllabus are not permitted. Selections may include improvised sections. Popular selections must be performed with either live accompaniment or an instrumental backing track. For Popular classes participants must enter the level based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

**Duets & Trios** Participants must perform one (1) selection in the appropriate genre and must enter the age level of the oldest participant based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, for competitive classes.

**Non-Competitive Classes** Participants must perform one (1) selection for Solo classes and must perform two (2) selections for Recital classes in the appropriate genre. Non-Competitive classes will be organized based on registration so that participants of similar ages and levels will be grouped together. Adults ages 29 and above must enter at the non-competitive level, and Adult & Child groups may enter non-competitive ensemble classes.

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### **BRASS RULES & REGULATIONS**

Failure to follow the Rules & Regulations below will disqualify participants from receiving a mark or class placement. Participants may still receive written and verbal evaluations from the adjudicator.

\*\*Participants should consult the 7. General Rules & Regulations and 8. Class Levels & Eligibility sections of the Syllabus.

Participants must perform with live piano accompaniment for all Brass Solo & Brass Recital Accompaniment classes (except where the syllabus indicates that a piece is "Unaccompanied") and performers must make their own arrangements for an accompanist.

**Backing Tracks** For Popular classes only, participants must use either live accompaniment (piano or guitar/ukulele) or an instrumental backing track that does not have back-up vocals. Performers are encouraged to use tracks with limited instrumental breaks (edited tracks/ reductions are allowed). Backing tracks must be provided as an MP3 file prior to the festival class (registrants will be contacted with instructions for submission).

Duet & Trio Accompaniment Piano accompaniment is not required but should be included if indicated in the score. Ensembles where the piano part plays an equal role, and the pianist is a class participant should enter in the "Chamber Music" division.

**Multi-movement Selections** One (1) selection may consist of multiple movements, where specified in the RCM or CC Syllabus (ex. Sonatas & Concertos). Participants must perform the movement(s) specified in the syllabus where applicable. For example, the syllabus may require that only one movement of a piece be played, or that two or more specific movements be played.

**Time Limit** Total performance time must not exceed twenty (20) minutes in total for any class.

Sheet Music Participants must provide the adjudicator with a legally purchased copy of the music for all selections (a purchase receipt or IMSLP listing must be presented for digital copies), even when the piece is being performed by memory. Refer to section 7.14 of the Rules, Regulations & Guidelines for more information about Copyright.

Memorization is not required for Brass classes.

### **OMFA PROVINCIAL REQUIREMENTS**

Participants should consult the OMFA Syllabus guidelines (www.omfa.ca) if they are interested in participating in the OMFA Provincials, as the OMFA requirements may differ from the KW Kiwanis Music Festival Syllabus. At least one (1) selection must have received a mark of 85 at the local festival.

**Classical Brass Solo** Two (2) selections must be performed (optional: three (3) selections for Open level). For trumpet entries selections must be in the current RCM or CC Syllabi (no exceptions). For all other brass unlisted selections will be accepted if verified to be at an appropriate level.

Popular Brass Solo, Duets & Trios One (1) selection must be performed.

One (1) selection must be performed, which may include one (1) or two (2) consecutive **Brass Concertos** movements.

Requests will be forwarded to a designated committee to determine if the piece is appropriate for a particular grade level.

**Chinese Instrumental Recital** Participants must perform two contrasting (2) selections from the appropriate grade level from an overseas syllabus such as the Central Conservatory or Music or the Shanghai Conservatory of Music.

**Duets & Trios** Participants must perform one (1) selection and must enter the age level of the oldest participant based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, for competitive classes.

Small EnsemblesSmall Ensembles may consist of 4-15 members playing traditional Chinese Instruments.ClassLevels: Small Ensembles should enter the age group that represents the majority of the ensemble members. If there is<br/>an equal number of members in different age groups participants should enter the higher age level.

## **COMPOSITION RULES & REGULATIONS**

**Failure to follow the Rules & Regulations** below will disqualify participants from receiving a mark or class placement. Participants may still receive written and verbal evaluations from the adjudicator.

\*\*Participants should consult the 7. General Rules & Regulations and 8. Class Levels & Eligibility sections of the Syllabus.

**Composition Guidelines** A composition is considered an original piece of music written and notated by the participant. Any instrumentation is acceptable. The notation must be in standard notation or a type of notation that exists within the spirit of the varied idioms typical of composition. Charts are not considered a suitable form of notation for this class (please ask the coordinator about the singer-songwriter class and how it differs from the composition class if you are composing original songs in a popular idiom).

**Improvised Elements** As a general guideline, <u>no more than 10%</u> of the composition should be improvised if the composition includes a portion of live improvisation.

**Performance/Recordings** Participants may choose to either perform their composition live or may provide an audio file in MP3 format (see below regarding Submission Requirements). A piano will be available for composition classes. Live performances may include up to 4 performers (to be arranged for and organized by the participant), and performers must bring their own instruments and music stands. Classes will not be evaluated based on the skill level of the performers and will be evaluated solely on the merits of the composition itself.

**Multiple Registrations** Participants may register multiple times for a composition class and must submit one (1) composition per registration. Those who register multiple times will receive a mark and written evaluation for each piece but will only be eligible for one class placement. For example, if a student submits two (2) compositions and receives the two (2) highest marks in the class, they will only be awarded 1<sup>st</sup> Place (2<sup>nd</sup> Place will be awarded to another participant with the next highest mark).

**Submission Requirements** Participants must email a PDF of their composition (handwritten or computergenerated) as well as an audio file in MP3 or WAV format to <u>danielle@kwkiwanismusicfestival.com</u> by March 31st of the year of the festival. Please mark this deadline on your calendars as soon as you have completed your registration. A reminder email with instructions will also be sent to registrants.

**Guitar Solo** Participants must perform one (1) selection from the appropriate grade level and any Repertoire list in either the *RCM Classical Guitar Syllabus 2018 Edition* or the *CC Classical Guitar Syllabus*.

**Guitar Recital** Participants must perform two contrasting (2) selections from the appropriate grade level and where applicable from different Repertoire lists (Level 2 and above) in the RCM or CC Syllabus. For example, if the grade level includes List A & List B the participant should play one (1) selection from each list. If there is a List C or D, then the participant may choose which two (2) Lists to select from.

**Etude Classes** Participants must perform one (1) Etude for Preparatory and Level 1 classes, and two (2) contrasting Etudes/Studies for Levels 2-10, from the appropriate grade level.

**Popular Classes** Participants must perform one (1) selection for **Solo** classes or two (2) selections for **Recital** classes. Popular selections should be covers from commercial artists in any of the following genres: Pop, Folk, R&B, Soul, Rock, Alternative, Indie, Jazz or Country. Songs listed in the RCM or CC syllabus are not permitted. Popular selections must be performed with either live accompaniment or an instrumental backing track. For Popular classes participants must enter the level based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

**Duets & Trios** Participants must perform one (1) selection in the appropriate genre and must enter the age level of the oldest participant based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, for competitive classes.

**Non-Competitive & Adult Amateur Classes** Participants must perform one (1) selection for Solo classes and must perform two (2) selections for Recital classes in the appropriate genre. Participants will receive a written and verbal adjudication, as well as a Participation Ribbon, but will not be given marks or class placements and are not eligible for financial awards. Non-Competitive classes will be organized based on registration so that participants of similar ages and levels will be grouped together. Adults ages 29 and above must enter at the Adult Amateur level, and Adult & Child groups may enter non-competitive ensemble classes.

**Failure to follow the Rules & Regulations** below will disqualify participants from receiving a mark or class placement. Participants may still receive written and verbal evaluations from the adjudicator.

\*\*Participants should consult the 7. General Rules & Regulations and 8. Class Levels & Eligibility sections of the Syllabus.

**Repertoire Selections** Participants cannot perform the same selection in different classes (for example, if a participant enters both a Guitar Solo class and a Guitar Recital class then they must perform 3 different selections).

**Multi-movement Selections** One (1) selection may consist of multiple movements, where specified in the RCM or CC Syllabus (ex. Sonatas & Concertos). Participants must perform the movement(s) specified in the syllabus where applicable. For example, the syllabus may require that only one movement of a piece be played, or that two or more specific movements be played.

**Time Limit** Total performance time must not exceed **twenty (20) minutes** in total for any class. In cases where multiple movements are to be performed, and the total performance time would exceed twenty (20) minutes participants may omit one (1) movement subject to the approval of the KWKMF Coordinator. Selected movements should be contrasting and should reflect the difficulty level of the class.

**Sheet Music** Participants must provide the adjudicator with a legally purchased copy of the music for all selections (a purchase receipt or IMSLP listing must be presented for digital copies), even when the piece is being performed by memory. Refer to section 7.14 of the Rules, Regulations & Guidelines for more information about Copyright.

**Memorization** is required for all competitive guitar classes, except for Etude classes.

### **OMFA PROVINCIAL REQUIREMENTS**

Participants should consult the OMFA Syllabus guidelines (<u>www.omfa.ca</u>) if they are interested in participating in the OMFA Provincials, as the OMFA requirements may differ from the KW Kiwanis Music Festival Syllabus. At least one (1) selection must have received a mark of 85 at the local festival.

**Classical Guitar Solo** Two (2) selections must be performed (optional: three (3) selections for Open level), and selections must be in the current RCM or CC Syllabi (no exceptions). One (1) selection may be an etude.

Popular Guitar & Guitar Duets & Trios One (1) selection must be performed.

**Beginner/Preparatory A** As a general guideline Beginner/Preparatory A is recommended for students who are in their first 1-2 years of study and are playing repertoire that reflects the level of the RCM Preparatory A list.

**Novice/Preparatory B** As a general guideline Novice/Preparatory B is recommended for students who have had 2 or more years of study and are playing repertoire that reflects the level of the RCM Preparatory B list.

Age LevelsParticipants must enter the age level of the oldest participant based on their age as of December 31st,2024, for competitive classes.Participants who are playing at the ARCT/ACCM level or above must enter the Advancedlevel regardless of age.

\*For all other Class Levels participants should refer to section 8. Class Levels & Eligibility.

## PIANO SOLO CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

**Beginner/Novice** Participants in the Beginner classes must perform two (2) selections (since the pieces are typically short at this level), and for the Novice classes participants must perform one (1) selection.

Participants should register for "1<sup>st</sup> Entry" if they wish to participate in one (1) class, and both "1<sup>st</sup> Entry" AND "2<sup>nd</sup> Entry" if they wish to participate in two (2) classes.

Repertoire may be chosen from any Method Book, or the Preparatory A & B Syllabus lists, and "Teacher's Choice" selections are permitted in any Beginner or Novice Level class. Teachers should consult the RCM Preparatory Repertoire lists to ensure the piece is appropriate for the chosen level.

**List Classes (List A, List B, etc.)** Participants must perform one (1) Selection from the appropriate grade level and list from the *RCM Piano Syllabus 2022 Edition, CC Classical Piano Syllabus 2018 Edition or Loud and Clear: A Guide to Levelled Piano Music by Women Composers.* 

**Etude Classes** Levels 1-2: Participants must perform one (1) selection from the Etude list in the *RCM Piano Syllabus*. Levels 3-10: Participants must perform two (2) selections (as required by the RCM Piano Syllabus). Participants may replace one etude with a work included in any edition of the *RCM Popular Selection List*. and one selection. Etudes do not need to be memorized. (This does not include Diploma List F: Concert Etudes where one (1) selection from the syllabus must be played by memory).

**Contemporary Classes** Contemporary selections must be written <u>after 1960</u> (inclusive), and do not have to be included in any published syllabus (Teacher/Student choice). Contemporary music is defined as a wide range of compositions that have both classical and modern elements. Repertoire that is included in the RCM or CC Classical Syllabi, or Popular repertoire (see definition below) is not permitted. Selections from the *CC Contemporary Idioms Piano Lists* are permitted (but not required). Participants may also refer to the *OMFA Contemporary Piano Guidelines* for a list of suggested resources.

**Canadian Classes** Participants must perform one (1) selection from any syllabus list at the appropriate grade level that is written by a Canadian composer.

**Chopin Classes** Participants must perform one (1) selection by Chopin from any syllabus list at the appropriate grade level. Those who enter a **Chopin Class** will be eligible to win the **Chopin Senior Piano Trophy** and a Scholarship Award (as decided by the Senior Piano Adjudicator). Participants may play Chopin in a List C class but will not be eligible to win the Trophy.

**Popular Piano Classes** Popular selections should be covers from commercial artists in any of the following genres: Pop, Folk, R&B, Soul, Rock, Alternative, Indie, Jazz or Country. Selections from the *RCM Popular Piano Lists* are permitted (but not required). Participants must enter the level based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

**Recital Classes Participants must perform two (2) contrasting selections** and should enter the level that they are generally enrolled in. The difficultly of the repertoire should be at their enrolled level or higher. Repertoire does not need to be included on a syllabus list, and students should consult with their teacher in selecting repertoire that is appropriate. The total performance time must be within the following time limits: Levels 1-5 Maximum 6 Minutes, Levels 6-8 Maximum 10 Minutes, Level 9-10 Maximum 15 Minutes, Diploma 20 Minutes.

This competition alternates between Piano and Strings & Winds each year, and 3 winners are selected to perform with the KW Community Orchestra. Eligibility requirements and details about the competition can be found on page 11 of this syllabus, and participants must register through the KWCO Concerto Competition section of the website.

\*Participants who wish to perform a concerto but do not want to participant in the KWCO Concerto Competition may register in the Piano Concerto section of the website.

Piano Concerto ClassesParticipants must select their level based on their age as of December 31, 2024, and the<br/>grade level that they are generally enrolled in. For example, if a participant enters mostly Level 9 classes, then they<br/>should select "Level 9 & Above" under their age group. Memorization is required for all Piano Concerto classes.

**Concerto Movements** One (1) movement of a concerto must be performed at the Beginner and Primary Levels. One (1) or two (2) consecutive movements may be performed at the Elementary, Junior and Intermediate Levels (with a maximum time limit 15 minutes). Accompaniment Participants must perform with live piano accompaniment for all Classical Strings repertoire classes (except where the syllabus indicates that a piece is "Unaccompanied") and performers must make their own arrangements for an accompanist.

**Backing Tracks** For Popular classes only, participants must use either live accompaniment (piano or guitar/ukulele) or an instrumental backing track <u>that does not have back-up vocals</u>. Performers are encouraged to use tracks with limited instrumental breaks (edited tracks/ reductions are allowed). Backing tracks must be provided as an MP3 file prior to the festival class (registrants will be contacted with instructions for submission). Backing tracks may be purchased from <u>www.karaoke-version.com</u>

**Duet & Trio Accompaniment** Piano accompaniment is not required but should be included if indicated in the score. The piano part is considered "accompaniment" when the piano part does not have an equal role, and the pianist is not a participant being evaluated. Ensembles where the piano part plays an equal role, and the pianist is a class participant should enter in the "Chamber Music" division.

**Multi-movement Selections** One (1) selection may consist of multiple movements, where specified in the RCM or CC Syllabus (ex. Sonatas & Concertos). Participants must perform the movement(s) specified in the syllabus where applicable. For example, the syllabus may require that only one movement of a piece be played, or that two or more specific movements be played.

**Time Limit** Total performance time must not exceed **twenty (20) minutes** in total for any class. In cases where multiple movements are to be performed, and the total performance time would exceed twenty (20) minutes participants may omit one (1) movement subject to the approval of the KWKMF Coordinator. Selected movements should be contrasting and should reflect the difficulty level of the class.

**Sheet Music** Participants must provide the adjudicator with a legally purchased copy of the music for all selections (a purchase receipt or IMSLP listing must be presented for digital copies), even when the piece is being performed by memory. Refer to section 7.14 of the Rules, Regulations & Guidelines for more information about Copyright.

**OMFA Eligibility** Participants who enter in Non-Competitive classes (including Suzuki classes) may be eligible for OMFA nominations if they perform selections that are included in the RCM or CC Syllabi (see Classical Strings Class Descriptions above) and receive a mark of 85% or above (marks will be recorded privately and will not be shared with the class).

**Memorization** is required for all competitive Strings Repertoire classes **except for Sonatas/Sonatinas** (as indicated in each syllabus). Exceptions include Cello Levels 6-7: List A (only repertoire marked with \*asterisk from List A must be memorized), Cello Levels 8-ARCT: List B, Bass Levels 7-ARCT: List B, Violin/Viola Levels 5-ARCT: List B.

## **OMFA PROVINCIAL REQUIREMENTS**

Participants should consult the OMFA Syllabus guidelines (<u>www.omfa.ca</u>) if they are interested in participating in the OMFA Provincials, as the OMFA requirements may differ from the KW Kiwanis Music Festival Syllabus. At least one (1) selection must have received a mark of 85 at the local festival.

**Classical Strings Solo** Two (2) selections must be performed (optional: three (3) selections for Open level), and selections must be in the current RCM or CC Syllabi (no exceptions). One (1) selection may be an etude.

\* Participants who enter in Non-Competitive classes (including Suzuki classes) may be eligible for OMFA nominations if they perform selections that are included in the RCM or CC Syllabi (see Classical Strings Class Descriptions above) and receive a mark of 85% or above (marks will be recorded privately and will not be shared with the class).

Popular Strings, Duets & Trios One (1) selection must be performed.

Adult Amateur Solo Two (2) selections must be performed.

## VOICE CLASS LEVELS

**Age Levels** For age level classes participants must enter the level based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024. For vocal ensemble classes participants must enter the age level of the oldest participant based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

**Non-Competitive Classes** Non-Competitive classes will be organized based on registration so that participants of similar ages and levels will be grouped together. Adult-Child groups may enter Non-Competitive Ensemble classes.

Adult Amateur Classes Adults ages 29 & above must enter at this level.

#### **VOICE CLASS DESCRIPTIONS**

**Vocal Solo Classes** Participants must perform one (1) selection

**Vocal Recital Classes** Participants must perform two (2) contrasting selections. For **Classical Classes** at the Intermediate level and higher each selection must be in a different language.

**Classical Classes** Repertoire selections are Teacher's/Student's choice and do not need to follow a graded syllabus list as long as they fit the classical genre (for example: traditional folksongs and art songs, etc). Participants may use the *RCM Voice Syllabus 2019 Edition or CC Classical Voice Syllabus 2018 Edition* as a guideline in repertoire selection but are not limited to these lists. <u>Opera, Operetta and Oratorio selections (including Recitatives in Arias) are only permitted at the Senior and Advanced levels.</u> *Repertoire that is not permitted:*\_Vocalises/Stand-Alone Recitatives, Popular or Musical Theatre (RCM: Levels 1-6 List C, Levels 7-10 List D, ARCT List F & CC: Levels 1-6 List C, Level 7 List D, Level 8-10 List E).

Musical TheatreGolden Age, Contemporary and Sondheim selections must be from a fully staged musicaltheatre production and participants must use versions of the songs as shown in the production book/score (Junior showversions are not allowed). Selections may be Teacher's Choice or students may choose from the CC ContemporaryIdioms Vocal Syllabus, or the Musical Theatre lists found in the RCM & CC Classical Voice Syllabi. Songs From the Screen& More selections are not permitted in the Musical Theatre Recital class.

**Songs from the Screen & More** Participants may choose songs that were written for or first appeared in animated films, movies, television, revues, cabarets, stand-alone songs in musical theatre style or songs from musicals that were not fully staged or produced. Selections must either be included in the <u>OMFA SSAM Syllabus</u> (which also lists excluded selections), or they must be submitted to the <u>KWKMF Coordinator</u> for approval. (Excluded selections may be songs that were originally written for a live production, songs that were originally released as a Pop song, selections that are primarily spoken, Junior show or simplified versions).

Popular Solo & Recital ClassesSelections should be covers from commercial artists in a popular genre includingPop, Rock, Folk, R&B, Jazz, Blues, Country or Gospel.Selections may also be from the *CC Contemporary Idioms Vocal*Syllabus (excluding Musical Theatre lists), or the Popular lists found in the RCM & CC Classical Voice Syllabi.Participantsmay choose to perform with or without a microphone at the Beginner and Primary levels and <u>must perform with a</u>microphone for all other age groups.\*Participants must use a backing track for Popular classes.A sound system will beprovided with a microphone at the venue.Participants have the option to bring their own microphone which should usea standard XLR cable.

**Self-Accompanied Classes** Participants should refer to the Popular Solo description above for repertoire guidelines. Participants must accompany themselves on piano, guitar or ukulele. Participants may choose to perform with or without a microphone at the Beginner and Primary levels and <u>must perform with a microphone for all other age groups</u>.

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**Singer-Songwriter Classes** Participants must perform their own composition in a popular style and may perform with piano, guitar or ukulele (self-accompanied) or a backing track. Participants must provide a lyric sheet to the adjudicator. (\*Classical vocal compositions should be entered in the Composition division of the festival)

**Vocal Ensemble Classes** Ensembles classes include **Duets, Trios & Quartets**, and participants must perform one (1) selection either A Capella or with live piano accompaniment (guitar, ukulele or instrumental backing tacks allowed for Popular Ensembles).

Non-Competitive ClassesParticipants must perform one (1) selection for Solo and Ensemble classes and mustperform two (2) selections for Recital classes in the appropriate genre. For Popular Classes participants may sing with orwithout a microphone and may perform with accompaniment (self-accompanied allowed) or a backing track.Participants will receive a written and verbal adjudication, as well as a Participation Ribbon, but will not be given marksor class placements and are not eligible for financial awards or OMFA Provincials recommendations.Non-Competitiveclasses will be organized based on registration so that participants of similar ages and levels will be grouped together.

Adult Amateur ClassesParticipants must perform one (1) selection for Solo and Ensemble classes and mustperform two (2) selections for Recital classes in the appropriate genre. For Popular Classes participants may sing with orwithout a microphone and may perform with accompaniment (self-accompanied allowed) or a backing track.Participants will receive verbal and written feedback and will be eligible for OMFA Provincials nominations if theyreceive a mark of 85% or above (marks will be recorded privately and will not be shared with the class).

## VOICE RULES & REGULATIONS

**Failure to follow the Rules & Regulations** below will disqualify participants from receiving a mark or class placement. Participants may still receive written and verbal evaluations from the adjudicator.

\*\*Participants should consult the 7. General Rules & Regulations and 8. Class Levels & Eligibility sections of the Syllabus.

Accompaniment Participants must perform with live piano accompaniment for all **Classical** and **Musical Theatre** classes and performers must make their own arrangements for an accompanist (except for Ensembles which may choose to sing A Capella).

**Backing Tracks** For **Popular** classes only, participants must use an instrumental backing track <u>that does not have</u> <u>back-up vocals</u>. Backing tracks must not exceed 5 minutes in length and performers are encouraged to use tracks with limited instrumental breaks (edited tracks/ reductions are allowed). Backing tracks must be provided as an MP3 file prior to the festival class (registrants will be contacted with instructions for submission). Backing tracks may be purchased from www.karaoke-version.com

**Sheet Music/Lyrics** Participants must provide the adjudicator with a legally purchased copy of the music for all selections (a purchase receipt or IMSLP listing must be presented for digital copies), even when the piece is being performed by memory. Refer to section 7.14 of the Rules, Regulations & Guidelines for more information about Copyright. For Popular songs participants may provide a lyric sheet but only if there is no sheet music available.

**Vocal Cuts** Vocals cuts are not permitted, with an exception for a repeated chorus.

**Original Language** For Classical vocal classes, selections must be sung in their original language.

**Mature Content/Censorship** Disclaimer: For 16+ age groups music selections may contain offensive language and/or content that may explore mature themes, viewer discretion is advised. For ages 15 and below selections should be age appropriate and participants should avoid offensive language and mature content.

**Gender Roles** Participants may sing whatever role or gender they feel applicable to themselves and any story line they would like to portray.

Memorization is required for all competitive voice classes, except for Popular Self-Accompanied classes.

#### **OMFA PROVINCIAL REQUIREMENTS**

Participants should consult the OMFA Syllabus guidelines (<u>www.omfa.ca</u>) if they are interested in participating in the OMFA Provincials, as the OMFA requirements may differ from the KW Kiwanis Music Festival Syllabus. At least one (1) selection must have received a mark of 85 at the local festival.

**Classical Voice** Two (2) selections must be performed, except for the Advanced level where three (3) selections must be performed (one selection must be opera, operetta or oratorio).

**Musical Theatre, Songs From the Screen** Two (2) selections must be performed, with the exception of the Advanced level where three (3) selections must be performed.

**Popular, Self-Accompanied** Two (2) selections must be performed (optional: three (3) selections for the Advanced level).

Vocal Duets & Trios One (1) selection must be performed.

Vocal QuartetsQuartets are eligible for the Small Ensemble division. One (1) or two (2) selections may beperformed.

Adult Amateur Solo Two (2) selections must be performed. Microphones and backing tracks required for Popular.

#### WOODWIND SYLLABUS

#### WOODWIND CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

**Woodwind Solo** Participants must perform one (1) selection from the appropriate grade level and any Repertoire list in their instrument's RCM or CC Syllabus. Accompaniment is required (see Rules & Regulations below).

**Woodwind Recital** Participants must perform two contrasting (2) selections from the appropriate grade level and from different Repertoire lists in their instrument's RCM or CC Syllabus. For example, if the grade level includes List A & List B the participant should play one (1) selection from each list. If there is a List C, then the participant may choose which two (2) Lists to select from. Accompaniment is required (see Rules & Regulations below).

**Etude Classes** Participants must perform two (2) contrasting Etudes/Studies from the appropriate grade level. Where the syllabus indicates "*Group 1*", and "*Group 2*" participants should select one (1) Etude from each Group.

**Woodwind Concerto** Participants may perform one (1) or two (2) consecutive movements of a concerto. Repertoire selections do not need to be from a syllabus list. Participants must enter the level based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, and should select the grade level that they are currently playing at.

**Popular Classes** Participants must perform one (1) selection for **Solo** classes or two (2) selections for **Recital** classes. Popular selections should be covers from commercial artists in any of the following genres: Pop, Folk, R&B, Soul, Rock, Alternative, Indie, Jazz or Country. Songs listed in the RCM or CC syllabus are not permitted. Popular selections must be performed with either live accompaniment or an instrumental backing track. For Popular classes participants must enter the level based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

**Duets & Trios** Participants must perform one (1) selection in the appropriate genre and must enter the age level of the oldest participant based on their age as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, for competitive classes.

**Non-Competitive Classes** Participants must perform one (1) selection for Solo classes and must perform two (2) selections for Recital classes in the appropriate genre. Participants will receive a written and verbal adjudication, as well as a Participation Ribbon, but will not be given marks or class placements and are not eligible for financial awards or OMFA Provincials recommendations. Non-Competitive classes will be organized based on registration so that participants of similar ages and levels will be grouped together. Adults ages 29 and above must enter at the non-competitive level, and Adult & Child groups may enter non-competitive ensemble classes

## WOODWIND RULES & REGULATIONS

**Failure to follow the Rules & Regulations** below will disqualify participants from receiving a mark or class placement. Participants may still receive written and verbal evaluations from the adjudicator.

\*\*Participants should consult the 7. General Rules & Regulations and 8. Class Levels & Eligibility sections of the Syllabus.

Accompaniment Participants must perform with live piano accompaniment for all **Woodwind Solo & Woodwind** Recital classes (except where the syllabus indicates that a piece is "Unaccompanied") and performers must make their own arrangements for an accompanist.

**Backing Tracks** For Popular classes only, participants must use either live accompaniment (piano or guitar/ukulele) or an instrumental backing track <u>that does not have back-up vocals</u>. Performers are encouraged to use tracks with limited instrumental breaks (edited tracks/ reductions are allowed). Backing tracks must be provided as an MP3 file prior to the festival class (registrants will be contacted with instructions for submission). Backing tracks may be purchased from <u>www.karaoke-version.com</u>

**Duet & Trio Accompaniment** Piano accompaniment is not required but should be included if indicated in the score. The piano part is considered "accompaniment" when the piano part does not have an equal role, and the pianist is not a participant being evaluated. Ensembles where the piano part plays an equal role, and the pianist is a class participant should enter in the "Chamber Music" division.

**Multi-movement Selections** One (1) selection may consist of multiple movements, where specified in the RCM or CC Syllabus (ex. Sonatas & Concertos). Participants must perform the movement(s) specified in the syllabus where applicable. For example, the syllabus may require that only one movement of a piece be played, or that two or more specific movements be played.

Time Limit Total performance time must not exceed twenty (20) minutes in total for any class.

**Sheet Music** Participants must provide the adjudicator with a legally purchased copy of the music for all selections (a purchase receipt or IMSLP listing must be presented for digital copies), even when the piece is being performed by memory. Refer to section 7.14 of the Rules, Regulations & Guidelines for more information about Copyright.

Memorization is not required for Woodwind classes.

## **OMFA PROVINCIAL REQUIREMENTS**

At least one (1) selection must have received a mark of 85 at the local festival.

**Flute, Reeds Solo** Two (2) selections must be performed (optional: three (3) selections for Open level). Selections must be in the current RCM or CC Syllabi (no exceptions). One (1) selection may be an etude. (\*Classical Woodwind classes are divided into Flute and Reeds)

Popular Woodwind Solo, Duets & Trios One (1) selection must be performed.

Woodwind ConcertosOne (1) selection must be performed, which may include one (1) or two (2) consecutivemovements.
